After three weeks and only a couple of days before the dinner party, I had the condenser replaced on the unit and paid cash. I had refinanced my house and could skip a payment. This was a process that I had started a several months before now. Once again, God has provided. He had laid the groundwork for this need months before.

I am too blessed to be stressed! Let your faith in God reduce your stress level. If we would take the time to realize all of the things that are blessings in our lives, we would know that the current situation is not as bad as we make it out to be and will also pass. What are the blessings in your life?
