GIVING TUESDAY

A few weeks ago, a regular *Red Bank Community Food Pantry* <u>client</u> called and asked me to <u>visit him</u> in the **hospital**; he had *heart issues*. During my visit, he shared that <u>the way</u> we **distribute** <u>the food</u> inside <u>gives</u> *people* who come for help much **dignity**. He also told me how <u>vital</u> the **sack** (hospitality) **meals** are and that <u>sev-eral folks</u> would have <u>nothing</u> to <u>eat</u> if it weren't for what we are doing. He said that *he watches us* and is inspired by the <u>kindness</u> of the *volunteers*. He plans to start **volunteering** and <u>coming</u> to <u>church</u> once *he* gets <u>bet-</u>ter. This man's story and the stories of *hundreds like him* would <u>not</u> exist if it weren't for **people** who <u>care</u> and **donate** to the <u>*Red Bank Community Food Pantry!*</u>

He isn't the <u>only</u> one **hungry**; more than *161,000 people* in **Hamilton County** <u>don't</u> have access to **healthy food** <u>essential to human life</u>. The **Red Bank Community Food Pantry** is now the largest **food pantry** in <u>our region</u>, acquiring and giving out <u>more</u> **nutritious food** than anyone else. We will keep doing this until we are no longer needed.

Today, due to the <u>high cost</u> of **food** and **fuel**, it is <u>more</u> **challenging** than ever for the *working poor* and **people** <u>living on</u> **fixed incomes** to put *food* on <u>the table</u>. More and more people must <u>choose</u> between *buying food* or *paying for other necessities* such as **rent** or **utilities**. Now, more than ever, the Red Bank Community Food Pantry needs YOUR HELP to <u>continue providing food</u> for *our hungry neighbors*.

<u>Tuesday, November 29th</u> is <u>Giving Tuesday</u>. Many of you may be looking to give to a meaningful **charity** on that day. Giving Tuesday is a *global generosity movement* unleashing <u>the power</u> of **radical generosity**. Giving Tuesday was created in 2012 as a simple idea: a day encouraging people to <u>do good</u>. Since then, it has grown into a **year-round global movement** that inspires *millions of people* to give, **collaborate**, and <u>celebrate generosity</u>.


